Design solutions for the rehabilitation of the existing structure since the 1960s and abandoned since the 1980s had to strive for simplicity, consistency and longevity. To this effect the perforated steel skin corten patterns obtained from hedging bamboo and spacious that surrounds this site has been designed in order to create a dialogue with the natural context immediately. The skin becomes blockers and together with stained glass panels, introduced refers to existing pre-school building work, help the internal space bathed with light filtered and coloured.
